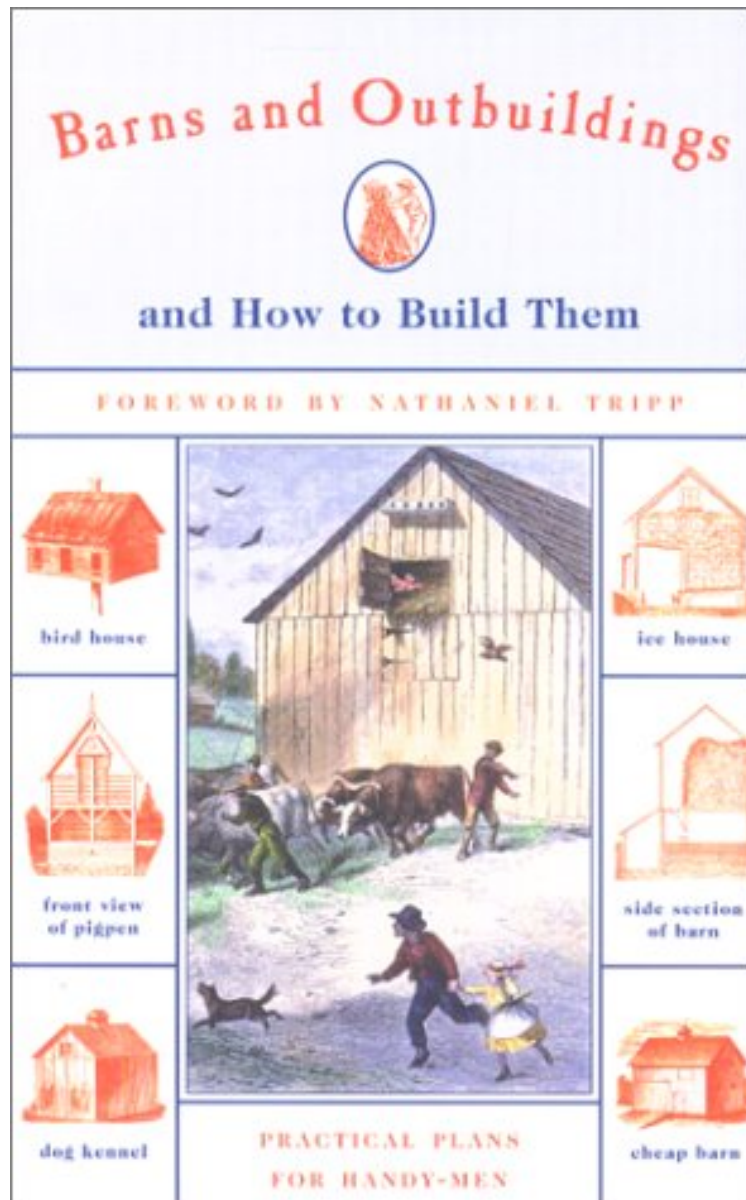

Given the original date of publication, the original publishing company took for granted that the reader of the day had the necessary skill set to undertake the construction of any of the barns and outbuildings described between the covers.With that being the caveat, it's a good idea to take some serious time to carefully read the chapters and refer to the illustrations to get an idea as how these buildings were built. The chapters are arranged according to the type of structure and examples of these structures.The book is worth owning if you are interested in farming and agriculture of the late 1800s or are into old building construction.Also of note, this is part of a series of books. You may find it worth your time to add them all to your personal library as I am doing.
