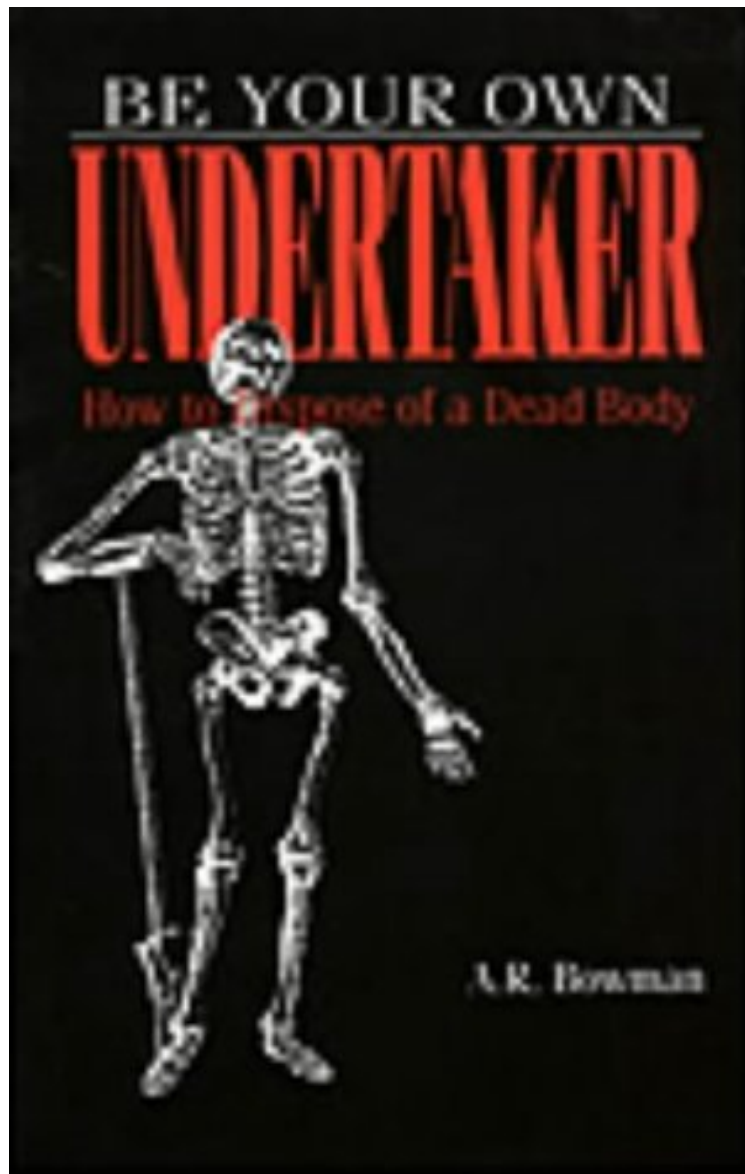

The Book Tells About What Happens To A Dead Human Body After Death. By William This book tells what is to be done with a dead human body once it dies. It says under normal conditions, the body will begin cooling from a temperature of 98.6 degrees F at approximately one degree F per hour. 24 hours later after death, the dead body will be approximately at room temperature. At the time of death, body wastes are often released. Steele As the disclaimer notes "The procedures in this book are presented _for information purposes only._" The author specifically notes in the concluding pages that he has left out information in an effort to prevent the book's misuse by criminals. Anyone actually attempting to use this book for reference or for practical purposes should take those two disclaimers to heart. Readers should also note the copyright date (now 12 years old) and note the significant changes in criminal procedure and practices in the past decade. Tests that were too expensive for a routine investigation in 1992 are often cheaper, easier, and much more common now. Some of the advice is likely to increase a prospective reader's chances of getting caught. Very useful generic advice, such as never waiving one's Miranda rights or consenting to a search are not even mentioned. As a reference work, it utterly lacks any footnotes, endnotes, or even recommended reading or indication of the author's credentials in crime scene investigation.

Being forced to kill somebody in justifiable self-defense carries with it the very real possibility of being prosecuted by a corrupt, incompetent "justice" system. A.R. Bowman has some wild, tongue-in-cheek answers to this dilemma in his outrageous study of the dark art of free-lance corpse disposal.
