I scoured my local library for reference material, only to be disappointed by the Black and Decker series books (just not enough meat in the material) and some of the other books didn't have enough diagrams to suit my taste.Thankfully, I found this copy of Mr Kreh's book and have been pleasantly surprised with my findings.
